\* Academic advisement: A program that provides students with information and guidance regarding their academic progress and course selection.

Accelerated program: A program that allows students to complete their degree in a shorter period of time than the standard program.

Admitted student: A student who has been accepted for admission to an institution of higher education.

\* Adult student services: A program that provides support and resources for students who are 21 years of age or older.

American Indian or Alaska Native: A person who is a member of a recognized American Indian or Alaska Native tribe.

Applicant (first-time, first year): A student who is applying for admission to an institution of higher education for the first time.

Application fee: A fee charged to students who apply for admission to an institution of higher education.
